This course is open to all staff from Regional Genetics Centres

Using interactive presentations, small group activities and workshops, the course will include practical suggestions for teaching and learning genetics based on current educational theory and good practice, including:

- engaging participants
- designing a course or teaching session
- teaching techniques for large and small groups
- giving feedback and assessing learning
- evaluation

This three day course is open to all staff from Regional Genetics Centres and all three days must be attended.

As part of the course, participants will prepare and deliver a presentation and will also prepare, undertake and report on a teaching session.

There is a maximum number of 16 participants per course. A Certificate of Completion will be awarded.

Participants must have the support of their Clinical Director to attend the course and to undertake the practical teaching activities which will be part of the course.
